The Regular Meeting of the Lingle Town Council convened at 5:00 p.m., January 17, 2018 with Mayor Siglin leading the pledge of allegiance. Upon roll call, the following were present, constituting a quorum:

Mayor Siglin welcomed all to the meeting and thanked them for being present.

CM Newcomb moved to approve the agenda as presented. CM Welte voiced a second and the motion carried without dissent.

CM Welte moved to approve the minutes of the January 3, 2018 regular council meeting. CM Newcomb offered a second and the measure passed unanimously.

**PUBLIC COMMENT:** Lingle resident Jackie Hill was present. Mrs. Hill voiced her concerns about the new Community Center coming to Lingle. One major concern was Lingle's ability to be able to afford the new Community Center; Council assured Mrs. Hill that this project will be fully funded appropriately before any construction ever starts. Mrs. Hill also stated concerns over residents "not knowing anything" about the upcoming Community Center projects. Council again assured Mrs. Hill that this project has been published multiple times in the newspaper as required and also on the radio. Mrs. Hill noted that the quarterly Lingle Newsletter would be a good way to disseminate information to the residents. Council thanked Mrs. Hill for bringing her concerns to the meeting.

**LAW ENFORCEMENT:** PC Moen reported 25 incidents this month. She continues to work on DARE with the school children, and she will be attending upcoming Domestic Violence classes.

**LEGAL ITEMS:** TA Knudsen presented a rough draft of an updated nuisance ordinance for Council to review. Upon review Council advised him to make some changes to the ordinance. First reading of the updated ordinance is scheduled for February 7, 2018 council meeting.

**ADMINISTRATION:** CT Sussex presented the financial report for the bond that was called and reinvested in a CD. CT Sussex also announced she turned in the grant to Oregon Trail Community Foundation to help bridge the gap in funding for the Community Center. She also presented a rough draft of the donation letter

for the Community Center. She has not received any responses for volunteers to help with the 100-year anniversary for Lingle.

**MAINTENANCE:** ATS Ochsner reported they have all the Christmas decorations taken down. He also reported they had another sewer blockage due to the freezing weather we have been having; they have fixed the problem so that it shouldn't happen again. ATS Ochsner was also attending a WMPA Board meeting this week.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:** Council by unanimous decision agreed to hold a raffle for the 100-year anniversary in which they would purchase a rifle and handgun, have them engraved with Lingle's logo and raffle the firearms off. Four-hundred (400) tickets will be available for \$20 each. The funds will be used to pay for the firearms and the 100-year anniversary celebration.

CM Greenwald announced the sign for Lira Park is almost complete.

Mayor Siglin led a discussion to clarify funding for the Community Center, in which he noted funding will be completely secured before any work starts on the Community Center.

There will be a kick-off meeting for the 100-year anniversary coming up on January 24, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. at Town Hall, everyone is welcome.

Mayor Siglin adjourned the regular meeting at 6:28 p.m.
