Mayor Siglin welcomed all to the meeting and thanked them for being present.

CM Newcomb moved to approve the agenda as presented. CM Welte voiced a second and the motion carried without dissent.

CM Greenwald moved to approve the minutes of the February 8, 2017 regular council meeting as published. CM Newcomb offered a second and the measure passed unanimously.

Lauren Nordeen, Tonya Nepper and Keri Bollington, representing Wyoming Child & Family Development attended seeking support for matching funds of their program. They presented all the aspects that Wyoming Child & Family Development support in Goshen County and asked for Lingle to continue supporting them in the good work they do for Goshen County. They also presented the Town with a drawing from the children in their program, thanking Lingle for their past support and participation.

PC Moen reported that everything is quiet in Lingle at this time.

LVFD FC Bangerter was absent, however Mayor Siglin reported there had been two large fires in the area. Mayor Siglin also presented the flyer that will be mailed out with utility bills this month looking to recruit more individuals who are willing to volunteer in their community; they are in need of EMT's.

CT Sussex informed Council the Wyoming Business Council Grant will be submitted this week for the Legion/Community Center.

TS Haeffelin reported to Council that Verizon wants to install a 160-foot high tower in Town on private property.

Mayor Siglin led a discussion concerning the Volleyball Courts at Whipple Park. CM Greenwald made a motion that if the individuals are able to raise the funds needed, they should be allowed to put in volleyball courts in Whipple Park. CM Asa voiced a second and the motion carried on a 4-1 vote.

CM Welte moved to approve Resolution #121 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF A WYOMING BUSINESS READY COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT GRANT APPLICATION TO THE STATE LOAN AND INVESTMENT BOARD ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY FOR THE TOWN OF LINGLE FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE LEGION/COMMUNITY CENTER PROJECT. CM Newcomb input the second and it passed unanimously.

Mayor Siglin led a discussion to revisit the time Council meetings will be held. It was agreed that Council meetings will stay at 5:00pm until further notice.

Mayor Siglin recently visited the State Legislature. He was present when Robert (Bobby Jo) Pontarolo was recognized for 50 years of service of being a Lingle Volunteer Fire Fighter. Also, Bill Law, current Goshen County Fire Warden, from Torrington was recognized for his 58 years for being a Volunteer Fire Fighter.

Mayor Siglin adjourned the meeting at 6:01 pm.
