Mayor Siglin welcomed all to the meeting and thanked them for being present.

CM Newcomb moved to approve the agenda as presented. CM Welte voiced a second and the motion carried without dissent.

CM Newcomb moved to approve the minutes of the March 22, 2017 regular council meeting as published. CM Welte offered a second and the measure passed unanimously.

CM Asa joined the meeting.

CM Welte moved to pay March 2017 bills in the amount of \$85,425.88. CM Newcomb offered a second and the measure passed unanimously.

LVFD FC Bangerter reported the Fireman's Ball was well attended. The Fire Department's ISO certification stayed as the same rating, they also had five (5) fire calls and three (3) ambulance calls for the month. Elections were held and the results can be viewed on their website at www.linglefire.org and also on the Town's website at www.townoflingle.com. They are working to get individuals enrolled in EMT classes and other certification classes. Their new truck will be coming back from Cody with the fire package on it in approximately 2 weeks.

PM Hill announced that interviews were held for the lifeguard positions this summer. They had fourteen (14) applications, and will be hiring the same amount of lifeguards they had last year, with an additional substitute lifeguard to keep them within their budget. The school has requested to hold an "end of school party" at the Lingle pool, and by a unanimous decision Council approved that request. CM Hill requested the pool be filled and heated by May 15.

TA Knudsen announced the town filed two (2) delinquent small claims in court. One of the individuals paid their claims and the other individual didn't show up for court on March 29th. He will also be looking into redrafting an ordinance for firearms within the Town, which will be current with State Statutes.

CT Sussex presented the financial report for February 2017 and placed it on file for reference. She also informed Council the first budget meeting has been changed to April 26th. A high school art class has requested that they be allowed to paint some park equipment which consists of swings, 2 horses, 2 elephants and a red slide, Council unanimously approved this request; the school is furnishing the paint. There will be a retirement Open House Party for Marty Anderson on April 27th from 11:00-1:00 at Town Hall. Clean up Days will be June 5th through June 16th. She also announced that Points West Community Bank will be working with the Town of Lingle on a 40-year term loan for the remainder of the money needed to complete the Legion/Community Center Building.

Assistant TM Ochsner reported they are working on the volleyball courts, weather permitting. They are also getting the pool and the bathrooms ready for the summer season.

CM Newcomb moved to approve Resolution #124 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF LINGLE TO SUBMIT A TERM LOAN APPLICATION TO POINTS WEST COMMUNITY BANK, LINGLE BRANCH; ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNING BODY FOR THE TOWN OF LINGLE FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE LEGION/COMMUNITY CENTER PROJECT. CM Welte input the second and it passed unanimously.

Mayor Siglin adjourned the meeting at 5:50pm.
