Mayor Siglin welcomed all to the meeting and thanked them for being present. Mayor Siglin called for approval of the Agenda. CM Lambert moved to approve the Agenda as presented. CM cook voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously. Mayor Siglin called for approval of the minutes of the April 6, 2022 regular council meeting. Following discussion and corrections of the minutes CM cook moved to approve the minutes with the corrections. CM Lambert voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously.

ORDINANCES: Third reading of Ordinance #357 **FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION
ORDINANCE FOR THE TOWN OF LINGLE, WYOMING.**

Following discussion CM Edwardson moved to approve the third reading of Ordinance #357. CM Lambert voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously.

Second reading of Ordinance #358 **AN ORDINANCE RENEWING A NON-EXCLUSIVE FRANCHISE TO TDS COLLECTION SERVICE INC., A WYOMING CORPORATION, TO OPERATE A TRASH AND GARBAGE COLLECTION SYSTEM IN THE TOWN OF LINGLE, WYOMING: DEFINING TERMS; SETTING FORTH THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE GRANT; PROVIDING FOR COMPANY RULES, RATES, FRANCHISE FEES; TERMINATION AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION.**

Following discussion of Ordinance #358 CM Cook moved to approve the second reading of the ordinance. CM Lambert voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously.

Second reading of Ordinance #359 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE NINE, CHAPTER FIVE AND SECTION FOUR OF THE LINGLE TOWN CODE OF THE TOWN OF LINGLE, WYOMING SETTING RATES FOR GARBAGE SERVICE AND REPEALING CONFLICTING ORDINANCES.

Following discussion CM Edwardson moved to approve the second reading of Ordinance #359. CM Cook voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously.

First reading of Ordinance #360 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3., SECTION 5., AND SECTION 15. OF ORDINANCE NO. 245

Following discussion CM Cook moved to approve the first reading of Ordinance #360. CM Edwardson voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS: Following discussion CM Edwardson moved to approve the Senior Center Letter of Support and Certificate of Match. CM Cook voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously. Following discussion CM Cook moved to approve the Lifeguard hourly pay rates as determined during the work session of April 12, 2022. CM Edwardson voiced the second and motion carried unanimously. Admission rates to the Lingle Pool were discussed and agreed upon. They will be posted on the Lingle Pool website. CM Lambert moved to approve the increases. CM Edwardson voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously. The hourly wage for the Maintenance Summer Seasonal employee was discussed and CM Lambert moved to approve the hourly rate at \$11.50. CM Cook voiced the second and the motion passed unanimously. The 2021 Annual Water Quality Report (Consumer Confidence Report) was presented to and accepted by the Lingle Town Council.

COUNCIL ITEMS: Mayor Siglin informed the Council and attendees that the 6th Penny initiative was voted down by the Goshen County Commissioners.

With no further business to conduct Mayor Siglin adjourned the meeting at 5:32 PM.
