The Regular Meeting of the Lingle Town Council convened at 5:01pm, June 7, 2017 with Mayor Siglin leading the pledge of allegiance. Upon roll call, the following were present, constituting a quorum:

Mayor Siglin welcomed all to the meeting and thanked them for being present.

CM Newcomb moved to approve the agenda as presented. CM Greenwald voiced a second and the motion carried without dissent.

CM Greenwald moved to approve the minutes of the May 17, 2017 regular council meeting as published. CM Asa offered a second and the measure passed unanimously.

CM Greenwald moved to approve the minutes of the May 13th and May 24th, 2017 budget meetings. CM Welte offered a second and the measure passed unanimously.

CM Welte moved to pay May 2017 bills in the amount of \$80,339.03. CM Asa offered a second and the measure passed unanimously.

Bob Baumgartner & Jenna Meeks from Goshen County Weed & Pest were present. They spoke of the weekly traps that are monitored and checked for mosquito activity. When the Culex mosquito levels are high enough to cause human health hazards they will begin spraying/fogging immediately. The grant they receive each year for spraying/fogging is down to only \$78K this year, so funds must be used wisely. Spraying for Lingle will most likely be the same as last year, which will be Monday & Thursday after 6:00pm.

PM Hill reported the scheduled inspection for the pool was positive; the inspector claimed the Lingle Pool was the cleanest in the County. However, the water tester that we currently use is old and inaccurate and must be replaced; PM Hill will research getting a new one. The inspector also stated the Pool must provide water for customers, so she will look into what it will take to fix the drinking fountain also. Attendance is good at the pool.

TA Knudsen presented a new contract for Waggin Tails, Council will review it. He also will review a new gun control ordinance for Lingle.

CT Sussex presented the financial report for April 2017 and placed it on file for reference. She also announced the Wyoming Business Council (WBC) grant has been submitted in full, and the date for WBC site visit has been set. She will be working with Community Pride non-profit organization in Torrington to submit another grant for the Legion/Community Center project. She announced the WAM Conference was full of good information and classes, and that she was voted to serve on the WAMCAT Board of Directors. Council unanimously agreed for CT Sussex & DCT Garner to attend the WAMCAT Institute in September. Council also unanimously agreed that Lingle should be a member of National League of Cities after CT Sussex presented the benefits that membership could mean for Lingle.

Mayor Siglin presented to Council for Lingle employees to have July 3rd as a holiday, along with July 4th; Council unanimously agreed. He also presented a Malt Beverage Permit for Wyrulec, which Council unanimously approved.

TS Haeffelin reported the pumps at the cemetery have now been fixed. They have been trimming trees, mowing & spraying weeds, burning the dump and grating alleys. They also set a pole for Vyve and added lights in the volleyball court.

CM Newcomb moved to approve Ordinance #333 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING TITLE 9, CHAPTER 5, SECTION 1-B TO INCREASE THE ELECTRIC RATES IN EFFECT FOR THE TOWN OF LINGLE, on third and final reading. CM Welte input the second and it passed unanimously.

CM Newcomb moved to approve Ordinance #334 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION FOR THE TOWN OF LINGLE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1 JULY 2017 TO 30 JUNE 2018, on third and final reading. CM Greenwald input the second and it passed unanimously.

CM Welte moved to approve Ordinance #335 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING CODE 4-2-1-1 OF THE TOWN OF LINGLE, WYOMING PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF CONCEALED DEADLY WEAPONS WITHIN THE TOWN OF LINGLE, on second reading. CM Newcomb input the second and it passed on a 3-1 vote; CM Asa voted the lone nay vote.

CM Asa moved to designate Points West Community Bank, Edward Jones and Wyoming Government Investment Fund as depositories for town funds. CM Welte entered the second and the motion passed without dissent.

CM Welte moved to designate the Lingle Guide as the town newspaper of record. CM Asa supplied the second and the motion carried without dissent.

CM Welte moved to formally approve the review of the town policy manual with the changes from Mayor Siglin, and the investment policy without any changes. CM Newcomb provided a second and the motion passed without dissent.

Mayor Siglin adjourned the meeting at 6:40pm.
