The Regular Meeting of the Lingle Town Council convened at 5:00 PM August 18, 2021 with Mayor Siglin leading the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call, the following were present, constituting a quorum:

Mayor Siglin welcomed all to the meeting and thanked them for being present. Mayor Siglin called for changes or deletions to the agenda and asked to have Darrell Taylor and Cathy Flock added to the agenda under “PUBLIC COMMENT,” a 24 HR Malt Beverage Permit for Pinnacle added to “New Business,” and Burns Insurance added to “UNFINISHED BUSINESS.” CM Lambert moved to approve the agenda with the additions. CM Welte voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Siglin noted a correction in the minutes of the August 4, 2021 regular council meeting. The Lingle Swimming Pool will be closing for the season on September 12, 2021. Mayor Siglin asked for any other changes and called for approval of the minutes with the noted correction. CM Welte moved to approve the minutes with the correction. CM Edwardson voiced the second and the motion carried unanimously.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Lingle resident Wendy Westman stated that she wanted to discuss the property variance process. It was discovered that she keeps goats at her residence and PC Andrews informed her that town ordinance forbids them in the town limits. Ms. Westman’s neighbor, Cathy Flock addressed the Council and stated she has no problem with the goats being next door. Following discussion, the Town Council suggested that she pursue a variance to keep them at her residence and in the interim may keep them at her home until the variance hearing. Ms. Westman agreed to apply for a variance. Lingle resident Darrell Taylor described a situation he encountered with an unleashed dog in Whipple Park and asked what actions can be taken. PC Andrews told Mr. Taylor that historically dogs have been allowed with or without a leash but must be under control of the dog owner. She has not been able to contact the dog owner in question but will continue to attempt to contact him.

POLICE ITEMS: PC Andrews reported: She is investigating a felony stalking case and that it has consumed most of her work time.

LVFD: FC Bangerter reported: It is business as usual at the fire department; The Lions Community Day in the park went well and that he appreciated the use of the Community Building for food preparation.

POOL ITEMS: Mayor Siglin reported: Adjusted pool operating hours and that four pool parties are scheduled.

ADMINISTRATIVE: C Reyes reported: It is business as usual at the Town Office.

UNFISHISHED BUSINESS: Following discussion the Lingle Town Council voted by consensus to switch insurance coverage for town properties and vehicles to Burns Insurance.

RESOLUTIONS: RESOLUTION # 135 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION BY THE TOWN OF LINGLE IN THE WYOMING COOPERATIVE LIQUID ASSETS SECURITIES SYSTEM FUND (THE "FUND"), AND DESIGNATING THE CUSTODIAN BANK OF THE FUND AS A DEPOSITORY OF THE FUNDS OF THIS POLITICAL SUBDIVISION.

Following discussion of Resolution #135 CM Cook moved to approve Resolution #135. CM Lambert voiced the second and the motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS: The Council discussed additions and changes to the Personnel Manual. CM Lambert moved to approve the additions and changes discussed. CM Welte voiced the second and the motion passed unanimously. The Council discussed a 24-Hour Malt Beverage Permit submitted by Pinnacle Bank for use in Whipple Park. CM Cook moved to approve the application. CM Welte voiced the second and the motion passed unanimously.

COUNCIL ITEMS: CM Cook discussed the nuisance ordinance and possible amendments. CM Edwardson discussed the process of amending ordinances. Mayor Siglin cautioned all attendees about the Covid-19 virus due to increased cases.

With no further business to conduct Mayor Siglin adjourned the meeting at 5:59 PM.
